The UK Property Market in Context

The UK is one of the largest and most stable residential property markets in the world.

Key structural characteristics:

- Centralised title registration via HM Land Registry
- Transparent transaction data
- Mature mortgage lending market with stringent affordability stress tests.
- Established landlord legislation
- Global financial centre status

Unlike many emerging markets, ownership rights are clear and enforceable.

There are no nationality restrictions on foreign ownership of UK residential property.

Expats and overseas could also buy properties via special purpose vehicle for tax efficiency.
